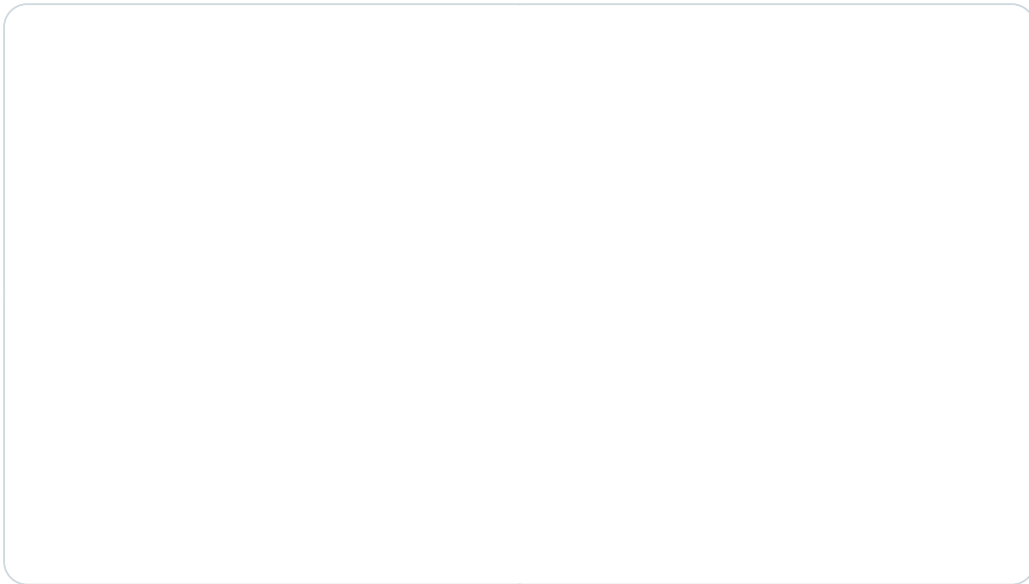

Shri C. P. Radhakrishnan noted ITS's role as a quiet but vital force encouraging progress, fostering connectivity, and unlocking opportunities for millions across the country.

The Vice-President said that India's telecommunications sector has grown under visionary leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi with robust infrastructure expansion, digital inclusion, and technological innovation.
