

Union Minister of Communications Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia Addresses Gramin Dak Sevak Sammelan in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh

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The Department of Posts organised a grand *Gramin Dak Sevak (GDS) Sammelan* at the Kartik Mela Ground, Ujjain, in the distinguished presence of **Shri Jyotiraditya M. Scindia**, Union Minister of Communications and DoNER and **Shri Mohan Yadav**, Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, marking a significant occasion to recognise and celebrate the invaluable contribution of Gramin Dak Sevaks towards strengthening last-mile service delivery in rural India.
