FARMERS WELFARE SCHEMES

1528. DR. AMAR SINGH:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE कृषि एवं किसान कल्याण मंत्री be pleased to state:

- (a) the total funds allocated and released to States, including Punjab, under various farmer-welfare schemes such as PM-Kisan, PMFBY, and PMKSY during the last three years;
- (b) the number of farmers who have benefited from these schemes, State-wise;
- (c) whether the Ministry has identified issues such as delayed crop insurance payments, shortage of procurement centres or lack of irrigation facilities impacting farmers; and
- (d) if so the corrective steps being taken to address these issues and enhance agricultural productivity?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF STATE FOR AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE

(a) & (b): The details of funds allocated and released to States, including Punjab, under various farmer-welfare schemes of Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) including PM-Kisan, PMFBY during the last three years is given at **Annexure I**.

Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) is an umbrella scheme, consisting of three components. Two components i.e. Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme (AIBP), and Har Khet Ko Pani (HKKP) are being implemented by Department of Water Resources(DoWR) and the third component i.e. Watershed Development is being implemented by Department of Land Resources (DoLR)

Under Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme (AIBP) and Har Khet Ko Pani (HKKP) components, central assistance released to State of Punjab during last three years are given in **Annexure II**. Under Watershed Development Component, an amount of Rs. 5505.72 crore of Central share has been released to them from 2021-22 to 2025-26 (as on 30.11.2025). State-wise details of Central funds released, water harvesting structures created/ rejuvenated, area brought under protective irrigation and farmers benefitted under WDC-PMKSY2.0 is given at **Annexure III**.

Information on the number of farmers who have benefited from the Centrally Sponsored schemes is not centrally maintained. The number of farmers benefitted under PM KISAN and PMFBY are given at **Annexure IV and Annexure V** respectively.

(c) & (d): As per Operational Guidelines of the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY), majority of the claims are settled within the stipulated timelines i.e within 21 days of the receipt of requisite yield data from the concerned State Government, by the insurance companies. However, during the implementation of PMFBY, some complaints were received in the past about payment of claims which are primarily on account of (a) delay in providing State Government share of subsidy (b) non-payment/delayed payment or under payment of claims on account of incorrect/delayed submission of insurance proposals by banks (c) discrepancy in yield data & consequent disputes between State Government and insurance companies etc. The pending claims on account of these issue are settled after their resolution as per provisions of the scheme.

Procurement centers are opened by respective State Government agencies in consultation with FCI before onset of procurement season, keeping in view the production estimates, procurement potential, and marketable surplus, convenience of farmers and availability of other logistics/infrastructure such as storage and transportation etc. and geographical spread of the State concerned.

The Government of India has undertaken several initiatives aimed at enhancing agricultural productivity. The details of select major schemes pertaining to enhancement in agricultural productivity is given as under:

1. The National Food Security and Nutrition Mission (NFSNM) is implemented with an objective to increase production of food grains through area expansion and productivity enhancement. Under this Scheme, incentives are provided to the farmers, through the States/UTs, on crop production and protection technologies, cropping system- based demonstrations, distribution of certified seeds of newly released varieties/hybrids, integrated nutrient and pest management techniques, improved farm implements/tools/resource conservation machineries, water saving devices, capacity building of farmers through trainings during cropping season, etc.

2. The Ministry advises the States and seed producing agencies to place the breeder seeds indents of newly released High Yielding Varieties (HYVs), stress-tolerant varieties (drought, flood and salinity) including stress tolerant/ climate- resilient /smart varieties (to tackle the challenges of climate changes in a more effective way) of different crops developed by ICAR Institutes /State Agricultural Universities (SAUs) etc. for further multiplication into foundation and certified seeds, so as to make available to the farmers, the required seeds of these crops varieties to enhance farm production, productivity and also to help farmers' profitability.
3. Government of India is promoting the reach of farm mechanization to small and marginal farmers and to regions where availability of farm power is low. It also aims at promoting 'Custom Hiring Centers' to offset the adverse economies of scale arising due to small land holding and high cost of individual ownership. Centrally Sponsored Scheme 'Sub- Mission on Agricultural Mechanization' (SMAM) is being implemented through the State Governments. Under SMAM, financial assistance is being provided for purchase of agricultural machinery and equipment, including tractors, to the farmers on individual ownership-basis and for establishment of Custom Hiring Centre (CHC), High Tech Hub, Farm Machinery Bank (FMB) etc.
4. The Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare is also implementing Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Per Drop More Crop (PDMC). PDMC focuses on enhancing water-use efficiency at farm-level through Micro Irrigation viz. Drip and Sprinkler Irrigation Systems. The Micro Irrigation helps in saving water as well as reduced fertilizer usage (through fertigation), labour expenses, other input costs and thereby, creating overall income enhancement of farmers.

Government of India regularly reviews implementation of these schemes/projects with States and UTs.
