SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL (ALAPPUZHA): Thank you, Mr. Chairperson, for giving me an opportunity to speak on this Impeachment Motion against the hon. Speaker. It is an extreme measure. We know that. We did not arrive at this option by choice. We have been dragged here by the systematic and ruthless choking of our Parliamentary democracy.

When the Chair, the custodian of the rights of every Member of this House, stopped being an impartial umpire ... the Opposition was left with no choice but to take such a step. Why did this happen? We witnessed it just now. The hon. Member, Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad ji, former Law Minister, spoke about the conduct of the Leader of the Opposition. Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad ji, you have to understand why this Motion came. When the Motion of Thanks on the President's Address was taking place, the Leader of the Opposition spoke about so many things. He quoted something from a magazine. Yesterday, my friend Gaurav Gogoi ji mentioned about it. It was a very critical moment for India. When Chinese troops came into our territory, our forces were asking the Prime Minister for a command. This was the reply of the Prime Minister ? ?■■■■■ ■■■■■ ■■■■■■, ■■■■■ ■■■■■ ■?

This is what our 56-inch-chest Prime Minister said. Every day, you are talking about our Prime Minister being a nationalist. This Prime Minister is saying this type of words. Shri Ravi Shankar ji also quoted something. After the Balakot incident happened, in the interview taken by News Nation, PM Modi said, ?the weather suddenly turned bad, there were clouds and heavy rain. There was a doubt about whether we can go into the clouds. During a review of the Balakot plan, by and large the opinion of experts was - what if we change the date. I had two issues in mind. One was secrecy? second, I said I am not someone who knows the science. I said there is so much cloud and rain. There is a benefit. I have a raw wisdom, the clouds can benefit us too. We can escape the radar. Everyone was confused. Ultimately, I said there are clouds... let us proceed?. This is your Prime Minister's logic. You talked about what Rahul Gandhi ji said. Because of the cloud, now it is the best time to act. At that point of time, this Prime Minister had courage to give direction.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Please address the Chair.

SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL: After the Chinese troops entered the terrain, our Army Chief asked for direction and, at that point of time, he said, ?whatever you think you can do?. This is what he answered. You see the difference?

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Hon. Member, please speak on the removal of the Speaker.

?You will be surprised to know that when I came to power, the previous Government used to take pride in saying that we made this law, we made so many laws, we made such and such laws. You must have heard it during elections. But I am different. They enjoyed making laws, but I find joy in scrapping all these laws.?

Your Prime Minister said this. ? (*Interruptions*) Then, statement was given in New York. The same way, a statement was given in Masdar City on August 17, 2015. Then, he gave a statement in Toronto, Canada on April 16, 2015. Also, he gave a statement in California, USA on September 27, 2015. Then, he gave a statement in London, United Kingdom on April 18, 2018. Even after becoming the Prime Minister, he used to abuse the Indian Government and the people of India. ? (*Interruptions*) We are ready to have a debate on foreign travel also. ? (*Interruptions*) Ravi Shankar ji, if you want, we are ready to debate on how many times your Prime Minister went to foreign countries, not only officially but also unofficially. ? (*Interruptions*) We can have a debate on that. ? (*Interruptions*) I know that Shri Nishikant Dubey is not in a good list. He wants to invite our attention and wants us to say something against their Prime Minister. That was the clear intention yesterday; we know that. ? (*Interruptions*) That was the

SHRI ARVIND GANPAT SAWANT: Yesterday, he did not allow me.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: You are yielding. I am allowing.

SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL: While quoting a rule, my limited parliamentary knowledge. ? (Interruptions)

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Please continue.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Please be seated.

SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL: Usually, I have a limited knowledge about the parliamentary procedure. When a Member is quoting a rule and asking for a point of order, the Chair usually admits it. But in this House, what was the practice? Whenever the ruling side Member is asking without any rule also, you are allowing the point of order. Whenever we are asking with a very, very pertinent rule for a point of order, it is not being allowed. This is clearly. ? (*Interruptions*)

SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL: Let me speak. This is the only occasion when we can speak about the parliamentary procedure.

SHRI K. C. VENUGOPAL: We cannot question about the Speaker on any other occasion. This is the only occasion. Therefore, parliamentary scrutiny has been completely corroded. When LoP is

speaking about Naravane's book - very much related to the President's Address - he is not even allowed. He spoke about Epstein file, Indo-US trade. Now, people are suffering like anything because of that trade. The entire country is worried, farmers are worried. Youngsters are worried due to the data issue. The Leader of the Opposition raised that very important issue. Why did the Indian Government surrender completely to the US? Why surrendered? ? (Interruptions)

Sir, you can see that. The American Government officials are declaring that India is allowed for 30 days to take oil from Russia. Who is telling? America. Is it not a surrender, Sir? Is it not a surrender? Why India is not uttering a single word against this?

Now today, what is happening in this country? The entire LPG dealers got a direction from the Ministry to stop selling cylinders due to the crisis in Western countries. What was the role of the Indian Government? This is not a debatable point. One of our Ministers is in the Epstein file. One of the Ministers in the Narendra Modi Cabinet is investigated on Epstein file issue. Is it not a debatable point? The debate is that - clearly the debate is that - India completely surrendered our sovereignty, integrity, and economy to the US. Why surrendered? It is because you have the scare of something. You have the fear of something.

America is completely blackmailing India. This situation was clearly pointed out in the speech of Rahul Gandhi ji, but that speech was completely stopped by the Chair.

In the parliamentary system, the Prime Minister should be present. Ravi Shankar Prasad ji mentioned that point. When the impeachment of Mavlankar ji had happened, Pandit ji had replied. When the impeachment of Balam Jhakar ji happened, Rajiv ji had replied. Now, who is there to reply? Where is our Prime Minister? Yesterday and today, he is not here. Why is he running away? Our Prime Ministers, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru and Rajiv Gandhi, had shown the courage to reply. Where is our Prime Minister to reply for the Speaker? Where is the Prime Minister? I think, therefore, that this issue relates to the fundamental principles of democracy and to protect parliamentary democracy. We know that we need to have the numbers. But whenever we stand up to speak something, the mic is not allowed. This is the only window for the Opposition to speak about the freedoms of Parliament, which are completely curtailed by the ruling front.

Personally, Om Birla ji may be alright, but his hands are completely tied up. How can a Speaker work in such an atmosphere? ... The impact on our parliamentary democracy is very dangerous. Parliament is meant for debate and discussion.

ji? Time will come, and it will not take much time. ? (Interruptions)
The people of India will teach a lesson to you because you are completely destroying the democracy in the country. ? (Interruptions) You are completely curtailing the democratic principle of this country.

This Parliament is a great Parliament. We are very happy that yesterday Priyanka ji mentioned about it. In the last Session, all the Ministers had only a single-point agenda, that is, to attack Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. Now, in this Session, I observed that there is only one agenda, that is, to praise Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. What a change! ? (Interruptions)

We know that one day you will praise Mr. Rahul Gandhi also. ? (Interruptions) I am very sure that one day you will praise Mr. Rahul Gandhi also. ? (Interruptions) You will tell that he protected our democracy, and he saved the country. You will say this one day, and I am very sure about it. Just wait for some time. ? (Interruptions)

Another very important point I would like to mention about our women Members of Parliament. They are also elected Members of Parliament with big margin. They came after facing great pain and agony through the political movement, and then only they became the Members of Parliament. The day when the issue happened, they went into the Well of the House. Of course, along with others, they were also there.

What drama had been created to protect your Prime Minister? ? (Interruptions) The Speaker stated that, ?I got an information that some very bad thing will happen to the Prime Minister as the women MPs were planning something?. From where did he get that information? If that information was received by him, then why did he not give it to the police? ? (Interruptions) Here, the security forces are there. ? (Interruptions) We are not ruling this country. ? (Interruptions) When you gave a very defamatory and derogatory statement against women MPs, that was one of the most irresponsible statements by the hon. Speaker. ? (Interruptions)

My point is that you have made a very serious allegation about the sitting Speaker's statement about the threat from women MPs who were rushing to the Well of the House and *gheraoing* in front of the seat where the hon. Prime Minister sits. *? (Interruptions)*

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SHRI KIREN RIJJU: Venugopal ji, you were present there *? (Interruptions)* Do not disturb *? (Interruptions)* I am talking to you *? 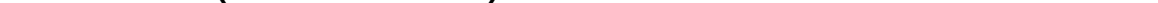

He was speaking about the defence which is very much related to the President's Address. You expunged it. You can see the records of the Parliament. 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SHRI E. T. MOHAMMED BASHEER (MALAPPURAM): Sir, thank you very much.

Sir, I wholeheartedly support this Resolution. The stalwarts of Indian Parliamentary democracy who held the Office of Speaker did so with neutrality, authority, and deep respect for parliamentary conventions, thereby upholding the dignity of the House and strengthening the credibility of our democratic institutions. It is a fact.

Sir, they have made milestones in the history of parliamentary system. Shri Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru said that the Speaker represents the House - its dignity and its freedom. Therefore, upholding the dignity of the Speaker is synonymous with upholding the dignity of Parliament and the nation. Similarly, our former Prime Minister, Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee, also said, 'Governments will come and go, parties will be born and parties will die, but this nation must remain, and its democracy must remain.'

Similarly, our first Speaker, Shri Ganesh Mavalankar; the Architect of the Indian Constitution, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar; constitutional jurist Nani Palkiwala; and many other eminent personalities have said the same thing about the nobility and sanctity of the Speaker. But what we have witnessed here - my learned friend explained it in a beautiful manner, and I congratulate him for such a marvellous performance - it raises serious concerns.

In the Budget Session, we saw that the Opposition was denied justice. They were in a very, very difficult situation. In a parliamentary democracy, we have never witnessed this kind of cruelty. That is what I want to say. The Leader of the Opposition was denied the freedom of expression. Freedom of expression was denied to one of the most eminent persons in Parliament. The Leader of the Opposition is an integral part of the system. So, justice was denied to him.

Several of our Members were suspended. People elect them through proper democratic means, yet they were thrown out of Parliament. That is also condemnable. Remarks about the Leader of the Opposition and other former Prime Ministers were very bad, because it destroys the culture of Parliament. You said things in such a way that these kinds of incidents happened here. We all know that. You are dictating terms to us. When the Opposition is speaking, you say, 'You may say this only.' It means that you are dictating to us; you are misusing the power in your hands. That is also happening here.

The Leader of the Opposition was forcefully silenced. The liberty of speaking in the House was denied to him. That kind of thing is going on. I believe that all these things were not done by the Speaker alone- it was done with the support and blessings of the ruling party. They are acting in such a way.

There is reason to believe that the Government is encouraging this kind of partisan attitude. The sanctity of the House has crumbled; we all know that. Lawmaking in the Indian Parliament has been downgraded drastically. I would like to say that introspection is very much required here in the best interest of parliamentary democracy. The Government has made lawmaking a mockery. Laws are made for what? Only for political interests. This House has a glorious tradition of good lawmaking. Unfortunately, that tradition has been undermined.

Similarly, we have witnessed a large number of anti-secular legislations. This Government seems to have developed a cruel habit of making laws according to its own desires and political interests. That kind of legislation is taking place. I have pointed out that we must engage in introspection and preserve our traditions. In different BJP-ruled states in India, various kinds of anti-secular legislations are being enacted. That also has to be curbed, I would like to say this.

Your style of functioning is a bulldozing kind of Bulldozing politics is being practised. The same wicked game is being played in this House as well. That is a shame for the nation. I would like to say that also. There are some more things, but I do not want to go into them. This Government's strategy is such that even breathing is at the mercy of the U.S. That kind of thing is going on. In spite of all these things happening, you are keeping silent.

Sir, we had a unique kind of situation in the country. We have spoiled all these things. So, that also has to be taken into consideration. Millions of people who are working in the Gulf countries are crying like anything because they lost their jobs. The Government is keeping silent. The Government is working as a silent spectator. That kind of thing is going on.

In Kerala, we used to get reports every day. They are crying like anything because of ill-effects of the present war.

I am concluding. The Government is trying to hide certain things. It is natural also. You may have that kind of approach. This Government is really hiding the faulty games. They want to continue that.

SHRI MADDILA GURUMOORTHY (TIRUPATI): Thank you, Madam. I rise to oppose the Resolution against the hon. Speaker. We stand here not to defend any political parties. We, YSR Congress Party, are neither with NDA nor with INDI Alliance. We stand here to defend the dignity of the House and the dignity of the Chair.

The post of the Speaker is not a political post. It is a constitutional post and we must respect the Chair. We support the Government whenever its actions benefit the public. At the same time, we oppose the Government whenever it becomes necessary.

Madam, from our experience, the Speaker's decisions may not satisfy everyone at all times. But those decisions must be taken within the framework of parliamentary procedures. The authority and authenticity of the Chair must be respected for the Parliament to function properly. We would also like to place on record that the hon. Speaker, Shri Om Birla ji, has given us adequate opportunities to raise our concerns regarding Andhra Pradesh in this House. So, our Party is opposing this Resolution against the Speaker. Thank you.

SHRI SUBBARAYAN K. (TIRUPPUR): Vanakkam. On behalf of the Communist Party of India, I welcome the resolution brought in this House for the removal of the Hon'ble Speaker, Lok Sabha. This resolution was not brought out of hatred. But this has been brought out of compulsions created by our past experiences. We do not have any personal enmity or anger against the Hon'ble Speaker. But his actions were not helpful for the opposition parties to perform their entrusted duties.

Election result is not only in favour of the ruling party. In order to pin point the wrong doing of the ruling party, people have voted for the Opposition parties as well. I therefore allege that Hon'ble Speaker has failed to do his duty in exposing the anti-democratic, anti-people, anti-political actions and misdeeds of the ruling dispensation. He is against the Opposition by disallowing to discharge their entrusted duties. Why is he doing so? Because he had learnt the lessons from such a place. When he assumed the Office of the Speaker, Lok Sabha, he should have forgotten those unwanted lessons which he learnt during his past. But he comes from a place which had taught him that democracy is not good. At bad times for India, he has become our Speaker of Lok Sabha with such ideologies. Golwalkar had taught lessons that democracy is not an Indian content but a foreign one. Present Speaker of Lok Sabha, remembering the lessons of Golwalkar, did not allow the Opposition parties to perform their duties. That's why this

resolution seeking his removal has been brought in this House now. Similarly, the Leader of Opposition is being attacked time and again. Is this the reason for this resolution? It is improper that the acceptable statements made by Hon. Leader of Opposition are also expunged from the proceedings of this House. Hon. Speaker, using his powers, has expunged so many thoughts and words of Leader of Opposition, which otherwise would have become part of the proceedings. I think that the reason behind moving this resolution may be because of this expunction of words uttered by Hon. Leader of Opposition in true spirit.

That will be the eligibility. I want to share my experience about time given to MPs for making their speeches. I am speaking on behalf of Communist Party of India. Our Communist Party of India has played a major role in strengthening Parliament since 1952 continuously. I come from such a Party. But these people won't allow me to even conclude my speech here. If you are not allowing anyone to conclude his speech, then what is there for you to claim about democracy? The ruling party only does only a lip service but by heart they are totally against upholding the democratic values. This I say with my experience. There are several data relating to this fact. I don't have time to go into that now. The ruling dispensation has not fulfilled their duties. Without fulfilling their duties, they took several actions. Several Bills have been passed in this House without any discussion. Without giving opportunity for the Opposition parties to even speak, particularly several such Bills were passed. Can a Bill be passed without giving an opportunity for the Opposition to speak? Is it not a shameful act on your part that without seeking the views of the Opposition, Bills are getting passed by the Government? Is it not a mockery? Therefore such acts of this Government have been the reasons for bringing such a resolution against the Speaker of Lok Sabha. I will conclude by saying one particular thing. I want to stress about democracy. Lok Sabha Speaker while replying should keep this aspect in his mind. Whether Lok Sabha Speaker is accepting democracy or not? Or whether he is still following the ideas and ideals of Golwalkar who never believed in democracy or democratic ideals. Whether the present Speaker has given up the ideals of democracy? I urge that the present Speaker of Lok Sabha should express with his present experience.

[SHRI K. RADHAKRISHNAN \(ALATHUR\):](#) I support this resolution to remove the Speaker of the Lok Sabha from his position. In the history of our Parliament, such a resolution has been raised only very rarely. There have been three instances in our parliamentary history where a motion of no-confidence was raised against the Speaker. First against G.

V. Mavalankar in 1954, then against Hukam Singh in 1966, and again against Balram Jakhar in 1987. On all those occasions, the Deputy Speaker presided over the discussion regarding the resolution. That was an established traditional practice to ensure parliamentary neutrality and justice.

However, unfortunately, the position of the Deputy Speaker in the Lok Sabha has remained vacant for the past twelve years. This is not merely a lapse in a standard procedure; it is a serious disregard for our parliamentary traditions. That such a vital constitutional position has remained vacant for so long raises grave concerns in our parliamentary democracy. This is an evidence that our entire parliamentary system is in jeopardy.

Madam, the office of the Speaker is one of the most respected constitutional positions in our democracy. Once elected, the Speaker is expected to act as the neutral guardian of the House, rising above party politics. The Speaker is the representative of all members, including both the ruling party and the opposition.

However, in recent times, we are witnessing a shrinking space for democratic discussions in the House. Opposition members are often denied opportunities to raise the issues of the people. We see a situation where laws are passed in haste without providing opportunities for important discussions. This House is not merely a machine for passing Government legislation; it is the nation's highest democratic forum where the concerns and needs of the people must be discussed freely.

Another serious issue facing the country today is the erosion of our independent foreign policy. Even major decisions related to our country's economic autonomy are being dictated by external pressures. We are in a situation where even matters such as from which country India should buy crude oil is being determined by the United States.

If things progress to a point where a foreign power determines decisions related to our economic and foreign policy, it challenges our sovereignty and independence. When decisions are made on such important matters without comprehensive discussions in Parliament, the significance of this great House itself diminishes.

If the Parliament is unable to discuss and take decisions on matters related to the nation's autonomy, then the very meaning of our parliamentary democracy is lost.

As our hon. Member Shri Anurag Thakur said ? (*Interruptions*) One thing Anurag Thakur pointed out, he compared the Speaker as a teacher. Madam, if the teacher is a great person the students will obey him. However, we cannot agree with the teacher, if the

teacher says that when Shudra is speaking, his tongue should be chopped. Or we cannot agree with the teacher who orders to pour lead into the ear of a shudra if he happens to hear vedas being chanted. We cannot agree with the teacher who asks for the thumb of disciple as gurudakshina (tution fee).

Once again I am supporting this motion on behalf of Communist party of India (Marxist) by saying that our country will be moving towards grave danger.

SHRI KRISHNA PRASAD TENNETI (BAPATLA): Hon. Chairperson, Madam, I rise today to oppose the Motion before this House and to place on record my firm and complete support for the hon. Speaker of Lok Sabha, Shri Om Birla ji.

When I stand here today to speak on this important issue, I do so with full awareness that I am not defending an individual alone; I am defending the integrity of this House. The authority of the Speaker is not a personal privilege. It is an institutional necessity. The Speaker represents the discipline, the dignity, and the drive towards achieving the lofty hopes and aspirations that our forefathers encapsulated in the Constitution of India. If the neutrality of the Speaker is questioned without reasonable grounds, we risk weakening the very Institution that safeguards democratic deliberations.

Madam, differences of opinion are natural. They are, in fact, the lifeblood of democracy. But attempts to erode the Institution in the name political disagreement, are dangerous. Let us remind ourselves of a fundamental truth. The dignity of Parliament is inseparable from the dignity of the Constitution itself.

Madam, three Opposition MPs have moved the Resolution for the removal of Speaker, Shri Om Birla ji. This initial proposal submitted was full of mistakes such as wrong dates, photocopied signatures, and therefore, technically could have been rejected. It is the generosity of Shri Om Birla ji who not only asked them to rectify the errors and re-submit the Motion, which was against him -- this Motion was against him and yet he accepted it -- but also admitted the same in adherence to the proper procedure. This speaks volumes about the personality and genuineness of our Speaker, an upholder of democratic ideals.

Hon. Chairperson, Madam, Shri Om Birla ji has had a long journey as part of Indian political system. We see flashes of his dedication to the development and upliftment of people during his time as a Legislator in the Rajasthan Legislative Assembly. During the 13th Rajasthan Vidhan Sabha, he raised more than 500 questions; an extraordinary demonstration of legislative

commitment. His contributions were so substantive that he was included in the list of 'Sadan Ke Sitaare', 'The Stars of the House', on more than six occasions. He led movements to eradicate malnutrition from the Sahariya tribal area of Baran district of Rajasthan, and led movements to help the victims of the Bhuj earthquake of 2001; aged pensioners with their medicines; and consumer cooperatives.

Madam, for a democracy to thrive, its Opposition is an important factor. The Opposition, by its very name, embodies an alternative political thought in the interest of strengthening parliamentary debate, discussions, and deliberations. However, it is sad to see the rather sorry state of affairs that parades before us every day, where our friends across the aisle march into the 'Well'. They shout, disrupt, and use all kinds of unparliamentary methods that strike at the very pillars and foundations of our Parliament.

On several Bills and debates of national importance, the Opposition has chosen to speak outside Parliament or on social media, while remaining conspicuously absent from the very debates where democratic scrutiny should occur.

It is very disheartening when the leaders of the largest Opposition Parties collectively and individually perform below the average in attendance, questions submitted, and debates. Incidentally, 281 Members of Parliament in this House are first-timers, and 74 are lady MPs. Their average is much higher than that of the leaders of the Opposition. While the national average of attendance stands at 86 per cent, questions raised at 88 per cent, and participation in debates at 17 per cent, the average of the leaders of the three largest parties is not even half of the national averages in attendance, questions, participation, and debates. Are they aware of this? Of course, yes.

In fact, it is this guilty feeling of underperformance that drives them towards repetitive and disruptive behaviour in the House. In recent times, we have seen the Opposition display unruly and unparliamentary behaviour. I myself have experienced this concerning change in their behaviour while sitting in the Chair. During the first half of the Budget Session, Parliament was repeatedly disrupted. The Opposition chose disruption over discussion. Eight Members had to be suspended after they engaged in serious misconduct inside the Lok Sabha.

Instead of participating in debates, these Members stormed the proceedings with slogan-shouting, chaos, and even threw

Madam, despite all these challenges, the tenure of Shri Om Birla Ji as Speaker of this House, has been marked by remarkable legislative productivity and meaningful institutional reform within Parliament. Under his stewardship, the 17th Lok Sabha recorded an impressive 97 per cent productivity, one of the highest in recent Parliamentary history. During this period, 179 non-financial Bills were enacted and notably, 58 per cent of these Bills were passed within two weeks of their introduction, demonstrating both efficiency and legislative momentum. Landmark legislations of the Constitution ? Women's Reservation Act ? Nari Shakti Vandan Act, 2023, J&K Re-organisation Act, 2019, the Muslim Protection of Rights of Marriage Act, 2019 were enacted during this period. I am happy to note that despite the best efforts of the Opposition to halt the Parliamentary proceedings, the momentum of our Speaker has continued into the 18th Lok Sabha where its first session functioned for 372 hours and 36 minutes, achieving an average productivity of 103.17 per cent while the 6th Session in 2025 recorded 111 per cent, Madam.

A historic number of 204 issues were raised during ?Zero Hour? in a single day, that is because the hon. Speaker Shri Om Birla Ji wanted to encourage, the highest ever in the Lok Sabha history.

Equally transformative has been the Digital Parliament 2.0 initiative including digitisation of over 8000 hours of parliamentary archives, artificial intelligence based search tools, digital attendance systems and the Sansad Bhashini Multilingual Translation Platform, strengthening accessibility, efficiency and modernisation of India's Parliamentary function.

Our Speaker Shri Om Birla Ji actively encouraged first-time and women MPs' participation in the House. I have personally seen him engaging, interacting and encouraging many Members across the party lines who had never spoken earlier to contribute to the Parliamentary functioning by questions and during supplementaries.

As someone who entered this House as a first timer, I can personally attest to the encouragement given by Shri Om Birla Ji, he entrusted me with the responsibility of serving on the panel of Chairpersons. This demonstrates his belief that the first-time Parliamentarians such as myself must be given an opportunity to learn and grow.

Hon. Speaker Shri Om Birla Ji recently introduced biometric attendance system. Probably this must have frustrated the Opposition because they have to now record it electronically.

Madam, recently, we have seen an increasingly desperate strategy emerge, where attacks are not just restricted to political leaders but to other constitutional institutions such as Election Commission, the Supreme Court of India and even the Defence Forces. It is deeply troubling when judicial proceedings are misrepresented for political gains within this very House.

In 2019, public claims were made both inside and outside the Parliament that hon. Supreme Court had endorsed the slogan *?Chowkidaar Chor Hai?* in connection with the Rafale procurement case. This assertion was factually incorrect. The hon. Supreme Court never endorsed such a slogan nor did it make any observation that would be reasonably interpreted in that manner.

The hon. Court itself later clarified that its observation had been misquoted and misrepresented. Such conduct goes beyond ordinary political rhetoric. When a Member misrepresents their words of Supreme Court within the Parliament, it undermines public faith in both the institutions simultaneously. The Judiciary is one of the most important foundational pillars of our constitutional democracy. Any distortion of its judgements within Parliament risks eroding institutional respect. Misleading the House and matters concerning the Supreme Court can be considered as legitimate parliamentary misconduct.

Madam, now, when it comes to the matter of Indian Armed Forces, it is a very serious thing. Repeatedly, the Opposition leaders have misquoted particularly on what is happening on the Chinese border and there was a mention about the 4000 square kilometres conceded, which is not a correct statement. This has deeply eroded the morale of the Armed Forces but for the gut feeling of our Forces and the leadership, they stood by their ground and they never got demoralized with the empty words made by the Opposition leaders.

Whatever the political differences, if there is one instance of parliamentary unity that has truly stood rock solid, it has been the representation of India as a country in foreign gatherings and institutions. Unfortunately, Madam, whenever our Opposition leaders go abroad, they go and sit in discussions, meetings, and criticise India in international forums. This I would like to mention once. In the direct contrast are the efforts of our hon. Speaker, Shri Om Birlaji, who has ably represented India's parliamentary democracy and its vibrancy with distinction across the world. Over the years, he has led or participated in numerous parliamentary delegations and international conferences. Most recently, in January 2026, under the leadership of our Speaker, India hosted the 28th Conference of Speakers and Presiding Officers of the

Commonwealth in New Delhi, further demonstrating India's leadership in global parliamentary diplomacy.

Additionally, to promote inter-parliamentary harmony and discussion, the hon. Speaker constituted Inter-Parliamentary Friendship Groups, giving each senior Member the chance to represent the interest of India in foreign countries. This has never happened earlier. I am sure that many Members here are aware that in 1994, the then hon. Prime Minister chose the then Leader of the Opposition, Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayeeji, to represent the interest of India in international discussions. Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayeeji went there, did his job, and returned without bringing the image of the country down. Could the same be trusted today? I do not think so.

In final conclusion, Madam, the real question before the nation is very simple. Should Parliament function through debate and discipline or through disruption and spectacle? As I conclude, I would like to state that the strength of the parliamentary democracy lies in the ability of the elected representatives to engage in structured debate, to question the Government through established procedures, and to uphold the dignity of the institution that embodies the will of the people. The Speaker's role primarily serves to safeguard these principles. The Speaker is not an adversary to any political party. The Speaker is the guardian of the parliamentary order. The Speaker must always stand firmly for rules, order, and the dignity of the Parliament, because when Parliament loses its dignity, democracy itself begins to lose its strength. The Speaker has only one duty - to defend the discipline, functioning, and institutional sanctity of the Parliament. Protecting the authority of the Speaker is, therefore, not about protecting an individual. It is about protecting the very institution of the Parliament itself. Hon. Madam, this is exactly what Shri Om Birlaji was doing, is doing, and I am fully confident that he will continue to do so.

With these words, Madam, I firmly oppose the Motion and entend my support for Shri Om Birlaji.

This was a significant gesture of parliamentary healthy-practice, as it broke the tradition of the ruling party always claiming the Speaker's chair. Similarly, Shri G. M. C. Balayogi made history in 1998 when he was elected Speaker of the 12th Lok Sabha, becoming the first representative of a regional party to hold the prestigious constitutional office.

Therefore, I urge my non-Congress colleagues in the Opposition to reflect carefully. If you continue to follow the agenda set by the Leaders of opposition Parties in the Parliament, then it may harm your political image.

I will conclude with a sincere suggestion to my friends in the Opposition. If you truly want to strengthen democracy and effectively challenge the Government, you must have leadership that is responsible, consistent, and credible. The real question before the House is not about the Speaker. It is about whether we satisfy somebody's ego. This House belongs to the people of India. The authority of the Chair reflects the authority of the Parliament itself. If we weaken that authority for short-term political gains, then we weaken the very foundations of our democracy.

The foresight of Vaipayee ji is being followed by Prime Minister, Modi ji in building institutions, not breaking them. It is time for the Opposition to stop viewing the Constitution as a shield for obstruction and start using it as a guide for conduct.

The first Speaker of Lok Sabha in 1952, G. V. Mavalankarji has stated, and I would like to quote that speech. The crux of the issue will come within that speech. Sir, I would like to quote:

?For real democracy, one has to look not merely in the provisions of the Constitution, or the rules and regulations made for the conduct of the business in the Legislature, but one has to foster a real democratic spirit in those who form the Legislature. If this fundamental is born in mind, it will be clear that though it is decided by majorities, parliamentary government will not be possible if it is reduced to a mere counting of heads or hands. If we are to go by merely majority, we shall be fostering the seeds

of fascism, violence and revolt. If on the other hand we could help to foster a spirit of tolerance, a spirit of freedom of discussion, a spirit of understanding, we shall be fostering the spirit of democracy.?

Sir, now, I would like to quote Shri Balram Jakhar, another former Speaker of Lok Sabha. He said:

?The authority of the Speaker does not come from the rules alone, it comes from trust and confidence of all sections of the House.?

That means that the rules may grant authority, but impartiality ends legitimacy.

Sir, I would like to quote Shri Somnath Chatterjee, the then Speaker. He said:

?The Speaker is not the master of the House. The House is the master and the Speaker is its servant.?

Sir, all this goes to show that Parliament belongs to both majority and minority. In a democracy, the Government has the absolute mandate to govern. Similarly, the Opposition has the equal responsibility to hold the Government accountable. The Speaker's Chair is the bridge that ensures both these roles function with dignity. The right to dissent is the essence of democracy. Freedom of dissent and freedom of debate are the hallmarks of parliamentary democracy. I feel that the floor of the House is the best forum when the dissent of the people can be expressed. If the access to the floor is restricted or closed, then the entire system will be suffocated, and eventually, one day, it will get destroyed.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Now, kindly conclude your speech.

SHRI N. K. PREMACHANDRAN: Sir, within two minutes, I will conclude.

The Office of the Speaker plays a vital role, not only in maintaining the dignity of the House, but also to protect and strengthen the great position it occupies in our constitutional set-up. So, Parliament is not the exclusive property of the Ruling Party or of the Treasury Benches, the Opposition is an integral part of our parliamentary democratic system. But, with all humility, let me say that sufficient and affordable opportunity may be given, in particular, to the Leader of the Opposition.

Sir, let me make one sentence. As far as the customary convention of the House is concerned - as Pappu Yadavji has said, I am also in this House from 1996 onwards - whenever the Leader of the Opposition rises from his seat, it is a convention of the House that he will be allowed to intervene. Similarly, in the case of Ministers, whenever a Minister rises from his seat, the Chair will be allowing the minister to speak. It is a convention. There is no rule, but it is a customary convention of the House. Unfortunately, recently, the Leader of the Opposition is being restricted to speak whenever he speaks. So, that has to be taken into consideration.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Kindly conclude now. You have made your point.

SHRI N. K. PREMACHANDRAN: Sir, let me conclude. I will conclude with my sentence.

Sir, my point is, the genuine democratic legitimate rights of the Opposition have to be protected. It is not by the Speaker alone. The Government is also having the bounden responsibility to see that the House functions properly. Previously, whenever there was a deadlock in the House, the then Government intervened. Nowadays, it is missing. It is the responsibility of the Government to see that the House is functioning properly.

With these words, I conclude. Thank you, Sir.

DR. MALLU RAVI (NAGARKURNOOL): Respected Chairperson, thank you very much for giving me time to speak on this Resolution.

Sir, I rise to support this Resolution because the institution of Parliament must always stand above partisan interests. Unfortunately, the conduct of the Chair in recent time has raised serious concerned regarding the impartiality and dignity of this Office.

Firstly, the hon. Speaker has repeatedly disallowed Leader of the Opposition, Shri Rahul Gandhi ji and several other

opposition Members from speaking in the House, thereby restricting their legislative parliamentary rights. Parliament is a temple of democracy where debate must flourish. It runs on discussion, disagreement and accountability, not on silencing. Silencing the Opposition means silencing the voices of millions of citizens who have sent us here to represent them. When dissent is suppressed, democracy itself becomes weaker. The Speaker's Chair must remain above politics. He must be the guardian of debate and not prevent the debate.

Secondly, the hon. Speaker made a very unfortunate and unwarranted statement, alleging that women Members of Parliament from the Opposition might physically attack the Prime Minister if he comes to the House. This is an entirely imaginary allegation. Such remarks have lowered the dignity and respect of women Members of Parliament in this august House. Women MPs represent the aspirations and struggles of millions of women across India. Casting such baseless allegations on them is highly inappropriate.

Thirdly, eight opposition MPs have been suspended for the entire Session merely because they tried to raise issues of public concern. Suspension should never become a tool to silence legislative questions. At least now, we demand that the suspension of these Members be immediately revoked in the spirit of democratic parliamentary functioning.

Sir, yesterday while participating in the discussion, hon. Member of Parliament Shri Lavu Srikrishna Devarayalu made certain remarks regarding the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014. He claimed that the Andhra Pradesh Assembly had not passed the Resolution. Without that, the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act was passed. As per Article 3 of the Constitution of India, there is no requirement for a State Assembly Resolution for the creation of a new State. Therefore, the formation of Telangana was completely constitutional and legitimate. He also described 14th February, 2014 as a black day. ? (Interruptions)

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Kindly conclude.

DR. MALLU RAVI: The Telangana Bill was passed by voice vote. I strongly disagree with that statement. That day was not a black day. It was a celebration day. It marked the fulfilment of the long-standing aspirations of the people of Telangana. Today, both Telangana and Andhra Pradesh are progressing and developing in their own parts. ? (Interruptions)

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Kindly conclude. Complete your last sentence.

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ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE (KOTTAYAM): Sir, I rise with a heavy heart to support the motion expressing no confidence in the hon. Speaker of the Lok Sabha. Let me say it at the very outset that this motion is not directed against the dignity of the Office of the Speaker. The Office itself is one of the most sacred pillars of our parliamentary democracy. However, it is precisely because of the sanctity of that Office that we are compelled today to question the manner in which it has been exercised in the context of the recent Naravane controversy.

Sir, hon. Members will recall that during the discussion on the Motion of Thanks on the President's Address, the hon. Leader of the Opposition attempted to refer to a material from the memoir of former Chief of Army Staff, General Manoj Mukund Naravane. The reference concerned the events surrounding the India-China standoff, an issue of grave national importance. Instead of permitting a structured debate on the matter, the Chair intervened and invoked Rule 349 to prohibit the reference, stating that the quotations from books or articles could not be cited. This House has, on countless occasions in the past, witnessed Members citing reports, books, Committee findings, and expert analysis while participating in debates. To selectively apply procedural restrictions at a moment when serious questions regarding national security were being raised has created a deeply troubling precedent.

Sir, what happened here? My friend Shri Anurag Thakur, while speaking said that the Congress Government ceded 38,000 acres of land to China. Some time back, we had a discussion in the Constitution Club and one former Chief of Staff of the Indian Army came there to give a talk. So, I asked him politely, 'Sir, in this standoff with China, did we lose any territory??' I am concluding. He smiled and said, 'I can only say.' *(Interruptions)* Just wait. I am replying to what Mr. Anurag Thakur said. He said, 'I can only say.'

HON. CHAIRPERSON: You address the Chair. I think you need not to address Mr. Anurag Thakur.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: I am addressing you, Sir.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: You are not answerable to Anurag Thakur.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: The hon. General said, 'I can only say that we cannot go to territories where we could go earlier easily, I mean, where we had full control.' What does it mean, Sir? Let history decide.

Sir, I can only say that and I can only quote a remark made by the former American Secretary of State, Dean Rusk, in connection with the Cuban Missile Crisis.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Kindly conclude.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: The former Secretary of State said, ?We came eyeball to eyeball and the other guy blinked.?

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Please conclude.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: Here, in the standoff with China, we came eyeball to eyeball and who blinked? Let history decide. I will leave it there.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Kindly conclude.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: Yes, Sir, I am concluding. The charges brought by the Opposition in support of this motion are therefore clear. First, that the Chair selectively invoked procedural rules to curtail the speech of the Leader of the Opposition. Second, that Members were prevented from raising an issue that had already become a matter of national discussion.

HON. CHAIRPERSON: Conclude.

ADV. FRANCIS GEORGE: Third, that remarks made during the debate were expunged. And the House was repeatedly adjourned, rather than allowing a proper discussion to take place. The fundamental duty of the Chair is not merely to maintain order but to safeguard debate.

Sir, the Speaker is the guardian of the House, not the gatekeeper. ? *(Interruptions)*

HON. CHAIRPERSON: I have my limitations because a number of speakers are here. I have already told you for two minutes. I have given more than three minutes.

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... : ?If you are right and you know it, speak your mind. Even if you are a minority of one, the truth is still the truth?. I conclude by saying that whatever is written in the Constitution is sacrosanct and sanctimonious. What I tried to raise in the Point of Order was exactly this, and my reservation to this Motion of removal is that it does not address the malice. ?

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The following information was obtained from the records of the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General, Washington, D.C., regarding the activities of the American Medical Association, during the period from January 1, 1960, to December 31, 1969:

Finally, the last step is to **draw conclusions** based on the results of the experiment. This involves **interpreting the data** and **discussing the implications** of the findings. The conclusions should be based on the evidence gathered during the experiment and should address the original hypothesis.

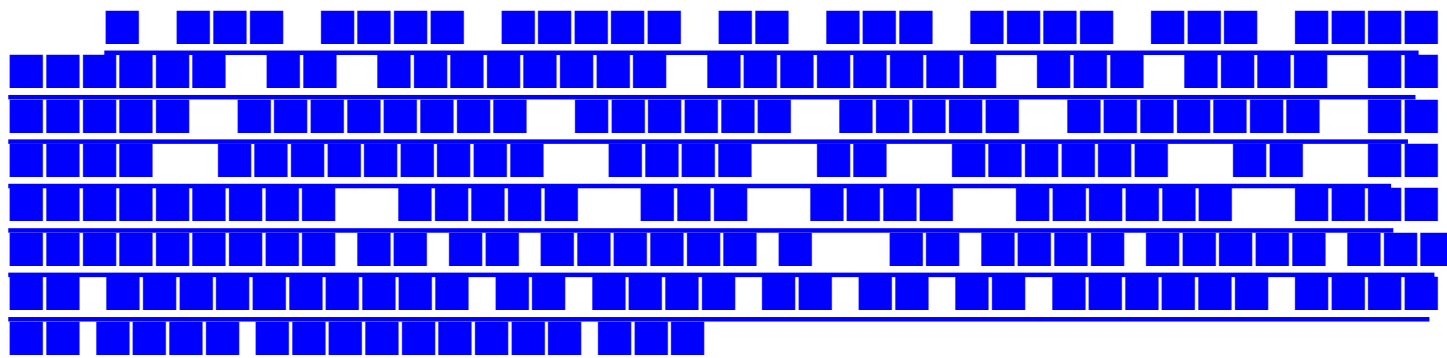
