

At Siliguri's 19th employment fair, 82 young people receive appointment letters

Minister of State for Rural Development Shri Kamlesh Paswan presented appointment letters to the youth

Call to national service under the Prime Minister's motto of 'Nagarik Devo Bhavah'

Over 51,000 young people across 47 locations nationwide received employment opportunities

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Under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, a grand event was held today in Siliguri as part of the 19th Employment Fair that took place at 47 locations across the country. At the Siliguri venue, the Honourable Minister of State for Rural Development, Government of India, Shri Kamlesh Paswan, formally presented appointment letters to newly recruited youth and urged them to play an active role in nation-building.



A total of 82 candidates at the Siliguri employment fair were issued appointment letters for positions in various central government departments.
