

CVC Organises Training of Trainers Programme on Master Circulars and Vigilance Manual 2026 for Vigilance Officers of South Zone

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The Vigilance Department of NMDC Limited co-hosted the Training of Trainers Programme conducted by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) on 17 September 2026 at Hyderabad on “**Master Circulars and Vigilance Manual 2026**” for Vigilance Officers of organisations in South Zone.

The programme was virtually addressed by the Chief Guest, Shri Praveen Kumar Sinha, Former Special Director, CBI, who emphasised the significance of the CVC Master Circulars and the need for revision of the Vigilance Manual.
